## About the Wayside Club Centre

The Wayside Club Centre has been responding to the needs of people affected by homelessness and social exclusion since the 1930s. It was founded by the Legion of Mary, a lay Catholic group, who continue to help to meet the practical and spiritual needs of people affected by homelessness through its delivery of the Club's Evening Centre Service which is funded entirely through voluntary donations. After moving to its current premises on Midland Street near Glasgow Central Station, the Day Centre was founded to provide a range of professionally delivered day services. Since its inception in 1982, the day centre has developed its service and expanded its staff team and group of volunteers. It acts both as an access point offering crisis response and therapeutic intervention and as a gateway to opportunity allowing service users to more fully realise their potential. The day centre works in partnership with statutory and voluntary providers to help deliver Glasgow's strategy for preventing and alleviating homelessness.
